Volume 1 and Volume 2 of our regular math series book as well as this book called Simple Solutions which is an excellent review of ALL math skills (Grades K-2). What We Did This Week:

RELIGION:

- ✚ Students understand that the best way to honor Mary is by Imitating her.

Integrated Language Arts – Continue Shared Story Henry Huggins

- Read and write words with the vowel digraph **ea**, **au** and **aw**
- Read and write word with the diphthongs **ou** and **ow**
- Work on identifying and writing all 4 types of sentences:
 - Declarative, interrogative, imperative and exclamatory
- Learn the uppercase cursive L, P, R, and B

Math:

- Students identify the fractional part of a set
- Students write equal fractions for a set
- Students take surveys and organize the data using tally marks
- Students use data to create pictographs
- Students analyze data on pictographs

Science:

- Build a paper model of the body to introduce and discuss
 - Major body parts and their function
- We learned about the following parts so far:
 - a. brain
 - b. heart
 - c. kidneys
 - e. spleen
 - f. pancreas
 - g. gall bladder
 - h. stomach

Social Studies:

- Use map scale to find distance
